



RESULTS OF THE CONSULAR OUTREACH IN LAS VEGAS, NV



Los Angeles, 21 February 2012 – Consul General Mary Jo Bernardo Aragon led a team from the Philippine Consulate General in Los Angeles and conducted a two-day consular outreach program in Las Vegas, Nevada, U.S.A. on 18 – 19 February 2012.

The consular outreach program was undertaken in cooperation with the *University of the Philippines Alumni Association of Nevada (UPAAN)* headed by Ms. Beth Ilagan, President.
