Los Angeles, 19 May 2017 – The Los Angeles County Board of Supervisors presented a plaque welcoming Consul General Adelio Angelito S. Cruz' assumption as Philippine Consul General in Los Angeles on 16 May 2017.

The plaque was presented during the weekly Board Meeting held at the Kenneth Hahn Hall of Administration located in downtown Los Angeles.

The Board of Supervisors is composed of five members and is the governing body of the County of Los Angeles. The Board has executive, legislative and quasi-judicial roles. As of the 2016 U.S. Census, Los Angeles County has a population of 10,137,915, making it the most populous county in the United States. It is also home to 374,285 Filipinos. This means that one out of 10 Filipinos in the United States lives in L.A. County.
