Los Angeles, 21 September 2018 – The Philippine Consulate General in Los Angeles held a training for its personnel on the importance and implementation of Senate Bill 1193, also known as “Civil Code Section 52.6 - Posting of Public Notices Regarding Slavery and Human Trafficking,” which requires certain businesses and establishments within California to publicly display a notice containing information regarding human trafficking on 20 September 2018.

The training was organized by the Assistance to Nationals and Gender and Development Section of the Consulate General led by Vice Consul Dyan Kristine Miranda Pastrana. END.
