08 November 2019, Los Angeles – The Philippine Consulate General in Los Angeles participated in a life-saving skills seminar dubbed, “Basic Training on First Aid, Cardiopulmonary Resuscitation (CPR) and Automated External Defibrillator (AED)” on 03 November 2019 in Glendale, CA. Said training was sponsored by the Philippine Overseas Labor Office (POLO)–Los Angeles in partnership with the Pilipino Workers Center (PWC).

Vice Consul Joan Macrise Corrado, who represented the Consulate General in the event, commended POLO and PWC for organizing the training with the goal to produce capable respondents to emergency cases and advance the skills and qualifications of overseas Filipinos in Los Angeles.
