Protests Over the Killing of African-American George Floyd

The Philippine Consulate General in Los Angeles informs all Filipinos and Filipino-Americans in Southern California that protests and related incidents of looting and vandalism are occurring in the Cities of Los Angeles, Beverly Hills and West Hollywood, sparked by nationwide outrage over the death of African-American George Floyd.

Filipinos and Filipino-Americans are strongly advised to stay-at-home, exercise vigilance, take safety precautions, avoid areas of protests and heed local government bulletins.

Kababayan residing in the affected areas are cautioned to abide by any curfew that may be set by your respective local governments.

As of 30 May 2020, the abovementioned Cities have set curfew hours from 8:00 p.m. of 30 May 2020 (Saturday) to 5:30 a.m. of 31 May 2020 (Sunday).

California Governor Gavin Newsom has announced the deployment of National Guard troops to Los Angeles, per the request of the L.A. Mayor Eric Garcetti, to maintain order amidst the protests.

The Consulate General is closely monitoring the situation through coordination with Filipino-American community leaders and concerned local government agencies.
